



VCCS ENROLLMENT BY YEAR AND ETHNICITY




FIRST-GENERATION STUDENTS BY ETHNICITY




PERCENT OF VCCS STUDENTS RECEIVING PELL BY ETHNICITY




CHANGE IN HISPANIC STUDENT ENROLLMENT BY PROGRAM TYPE




HISPANIC STUDENTS IN STEM

FALL HISPANIC STUDENT ENROLLMENT IN VIRGINIA



- Have achieved graduation and transfer rates similar to non-Hispanic students
- Increasingly pursued
 STEM fields
- Increasingly enrolled in transfer programs

- Continuing momentum will be a student services challenge
 - More first-generation
 Hispanic students
 - More Hispanic students receiving Pell
- Virginia has the opportunity to be a national leader
 - Only 13.9% of Hispanics have earned a Bachelor's degree or higher in the United States
